More examples from the motorcycle infantry are seen above, including a very early one that was worn in the early 1930's, before *Waffenfarben* were worn on shoulder straps. **Below:** Individual examples of shoulder boards and straps from reconnaissance battalions. Here: *Aufklärungs-Abteilungen 2-4 (mot)*, representing the 12. *Panzer-Division*, the 3. *Panzer-Division* and the 1. *Panzer-Division*. The 2/2 and the 2/3 (next to last in the row) straps are both on black badge cloth, designed for wear on the *Panzer* uniform. The 2/4 for the *Leutnant* could have been worn on either the black *Panzer* tunic or field-gray uniforms. The remaining straps are either sew-in for dress uniforms or slip-on for field uniforms.
