Two views of the first-pattern *Panzer* tunic. On the **opposite page** is a uniform worn by a scout assigned to the reconnaissance schoolhouse at Krampnitz. The interior stampings indicated the jacket was issued from the supply room of the armored car troop of the testing and training battalion. (Courtesy of John Suprin) On this page is a jacket from a scout assigned to two different reconnaissance formations, as indicated by the unit markings in his jacket from *Aufklärungs-Regiment 6* and *Aufklärungs-Abteilung 8*, both formations that wore golden yellow. The jacket, which was produced and issued in 1935, originally had rose-pink piping, which was probably removed when the scout had to change his *Waffenfarbe*. Several features indicate this jacket was worn in combat operations and the field: First, there is a snap fastener at the top of the front panel to facilitate access to the interior pocket. Second, the lining has been extensively repaired, evidence of years of hard use.
