On the **opposite page** is a second-pattern *Panzer* tunic that was privately purchased by an officer in the headquarters of *Aufklärungs-Regiment 9* of the *4. leichte Division* or its 2nd Battalion, which was the armored car battalion. When the jacket was originally purchased, there was still a ticket stub for the movies in a town in the *Sudetenland* that the regiment was garrisoned in in 1939. **This page:** Another second-pattern jacket, this time without collar piping but having copper brown insignia. The *Waffenfarbe* was hand applied after replacing the original rose pink piping on the insignia. There is also a shadow on the lower left sleeve, which is the location where an *Afrika* campaign sleeve band would have been worn, leading one to the supposition that this scout may have been assigned to either *Aufklärungs-Abteilung 3* or *33* in North Africa.
